NOSC 2012 – hosted by The University of Alabama – offers participants the unique opportunity to visit sites that made civil rights history. If you sign for the tour, you will visit Brown Chapel AME Church and First Baptist Church in Selma, where Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., visited during the movement. They will also visit the National Voting Rights Museum in downtown Selma and end the tour by walking across Edmund Pettus Bridge, where “Bloody Sunday” took place, an event re-enacted every year on the anniversary of the event that took place on March 7, 1965.
